



SIX TIPS TO DEVELOP AN EFFECTIVE RELATIONSHIP WITH THE FRATERNITY AND SORORITY LIFE ADVISOR

1. Engage in frequent and unsolicited communication to discuss chapter culture and both fraternity and campus initiatives and meet, at least once yearly, in person with the fraternity and sorority advisor and if possible the vice president of student affairs
2. Utilize the fraternity and sorority advisor as a resource in recruiting Chapter Advisory Board Members that are both members or nonmembers of Phi Delta Theta
3. Intentionally communicate Phi Delta Theta's risk management policies, minimum chapter standards, and expectation and desire for collaboration in any potential chapter or individual conduct
4. Speak honestly and ask thoughtful questions in regards to both yours and the advisers assessment of the chapter culture and what campus resources may be impactful
5. Encourage Chapter Advisory Boards and chapter leaders to meet with and discuss issues and opportunities with the fraternity and sorority advisor on a regular basis
6. Encourage your chapters to invite the fraternity and sorority advisor and vice president of student affairs to speak at a chapter meetings Phikeia meetings, and attend appropriate events each year and where sensible, encourage and/or invite the fraternity and sorority advisor to participate in Province Retreats or apply to facilitate at a Phi Delta Theta conference
